Preface for Volume 21

Since the publication of *Flora of North America* volume 5, the ninth volume in the *Flora* series, in early 2005, Guy Baillargeon, Barney L. Lipscomb, Jay A. Raveill (Taxon Editor), Michael A. Vincent (Taxon Editor), and Kay Yatskievych (Managing Editor and Production Coordinator) have become members of the Flora of North America Association Board of Directors. The Board succeeded the former Editorial Committee as the result of a reorganization finalized in 2003, but for the sake of continuity of citation, authorship of *Flora* volumes is still to be cited as "Flora of North America Editorial Committee, eds."

Sadly, in late 2005, two long-standing members of the FNAA Board, John W. Thieret and Grady L. Webster, passed away. They will be greatly missed.

The vast majority of editorial processing for the three, simultaneously-published Asteraceae volumes of the *Flora* was undertaken at the Botanical Research Institute of Texas in Fort Worth. Considerable editorial processing of treatments and writing of suprageneric descriptions and keys were done at the Universit'de Montréal and at the University of California, Berkeley. The maps were prepared at the editorial center at the Missouri Botanical Garden in St. Louis based on taxon distribution statements found in the treatments along with additional data for the indicators showing occurrence in Alaska, Greenland, and the larger Canadian provinces and territories. Pre-press production for the Asteraceae volumes, including typesetting and layout, plus coordination for all aspects of planning, executing, scanning, and labeling the illustrations, was done at the the St. Louis center.

In addition to her duties as the project's Illustrations Coordinator, Yevonn Wilson-Ramsey prepared the illustrations for numerous taxa of Heliantheae (except those credited here to others). Other illustrations were prepared by Barbara Alongi, for taxa of Heliantheae (Acanthospermum, Achyrachaena, Acmella, Adenophyllum, Amauriopsis, Amblyopappus, Ambrosia, Bahia, Bartlettia, Bebbia, Flaveria, Florestina, Flourensia, Gaillardia, Jensia, Kyhosia, Lagascea, Lagophylla, Leuciva, Lindheimera, Madia, and Picradeniopsis); by Sheila Flinchpaugh, for Balduina (Heliantheae); by Bee F. Gunn, for taxa of Heliantheae (Pericome, Perityle, Raillardella, Sanvitalia, Sartwellia, Schkuhria, Smallanthus, Sphagneticola, and Synedrella); by Linny Heagy, for all genera in Eupatorieae, including the color frontispiece depicting Liatris cylindracea, and taxa of Heliantheae (Chaenactis, Chamaechaenactis, Chrysogonum, Dicranocarpus, Heterosperma, and Sclerocarpus); by Marjorie C. Leggitt, for taxa of Heliantheae (Bahiopsis, Blepharipappus, Blepharizonia, Borrichia, Calycadenia, Calyptocarpus, Carlquistia, Centromadia, Cyclachaena, Deinandra, Dicoria, Dimeresia, Dysodiopsis, Dyssodia, Eatonella, Eclipta, Guardiola, Haploësthes, Harmonia, Helianthus, Heliomeris, Heliopsis, Hemizonia, Holocarpha, Hymenopappus, Phoebanthus, and Viguiera); by John Myers, for taxa of

Heliantheae (Agnorhiza, Balsamorhiza, Berlandiera, Cosmos, Echinacea, Engelmannia, Orochaenactis, Pectis, Rudbeckia, Scabrethia, and Wyethia); and by Linda Ann Vorobik, for taxa of Heliantheae (Oxytenia, Palafoxia, Parthenice, Parthenium, Pascalia, Peucephyllum, Plateilema, Platyschkuhria, Polymnia, Porophyllum, Psathyrotes, Psathyrotopsis, and Pseudoclappia).
